Southern Highlands Botanic Gardens

We are hoping that we will be able to have a plaque here commemorating our school and are liaising with the committee who have approached us via SCEGGS Darlinghurst.



The plan is for a unique botanic gardens presenting a balance between the historical site of Bong Bong Common, horticultural and natural landscapes, a nature reserve and passive recreation, all situated on the riparian corridor along the banks of the Wingecarribee River.

Bong Bong Common - On the banks of the Wingecarribee River, not far from the bridge is the site of the initial European settlement in the Southern Highlands. Between 1821 and 1831 a single row of government buildings was erected providing housing for constables and soldiers, a lockup, a store, a school and a post office.
