

When Dragons Whisper, Haunted by the Shadow of Tiananmen



On Friday 5th June, I joined Miss Valerie Horniman, Moss Vale Headmistress from 1965 to 1972, at SCEGGS Darlinghurst, to meet with Miss Jenny Allum, Headmistress, and present her with a copy of the book "When Dragons Whisper, Haunted by the Shadow of Tiananmen" and a drawing of "Hammond House, looking over to the Chapel", by Joyce Trickett. Miss Horniman had spent a long time, after leaving Moss Vale, working in China for the Church Missionary Society as an English teacher and has written her memoirs, starting with the aftermath of Tiananmen. It was a delightful meeting, with Miss Allum graciously accepting the inscribed book for the School Library and the picture, which will be hung in a conspicuous place, with an attribute. Miss Horniman reminisced about her time at Moss Vale and her numerous trips to China. The book itself is full of interesting experiences and reflections, and
