After school she enlisted in the W.R.A.N.S., was appointed to Harman where she found work interesting and stimulating.

Following the war she trained at the Australian College of Physical Education, taught at N.E.G.S. and later went to England.

She settled in London, taught at two schools, enjoyed a very satisfying life and could have remained but her Mother became ill and Father summonsed her home. She nursed her Mother back to health, later her Father became ill and died.

Sometime later she was appointed to SCEGGS Wollongong in a part-time positions as she felt she should spend time with her Mother who later moved to Mowll Village.

Barbara's health deteriorated and eventually she had to sell her flat in Vaucluse and move in to 'care, first at Randwick and latterly at Croydon where the nursing care was very good indeed and where she died on 14 March 2019.

Robyn and Dennis were married in Sydney on December 30, 1969. After returning to the US, they resided in West Hempstead, New York. They returned to Sydney in July 1970. Eight years later, the family returned to the US. She and Dennis travelled frequently to Sydney to visit family and friends (although she was not very fond of flying.

Robyn came to SCEGGS in sixth class.

Robyn's father owned K.D. Francis chocolate factory and you can be assured the classes she was in always had the sweet stall for the fetes.

Robyn participated in all sports, guide company, school and chapel choirs.

I remember one day when in upper Howard Miss Graham asked why she was wearing a cape at the end of school term. Before she could reply two cooked chickens fell out and down the stairs. They were for our midnight feast.

Another incident I remember Robyn came to Badham's House and whispered. Don't tell anyone but Howard burnt down last night.

After school Robyn went to Royal Prince Alfred Hospital and qualified as a Registered Nurse. Her friend Dorothy McGrath asked her to be a bridesmaid at her wedding. There the best man was Dennis Bauer. They later married and had 2 girls and 1 boy and they moved to America, where Dennis was from.
